MONITORING COMPLIANCE

Self-Reporting at Registration Renewal

Each year, NANB requires members to self-report continuing competence information on the registration renewal form by answering questions indicating whether or not they have met the CCP requirements.

CCP Audit

Compliance with the CCP will be monitored through an audit process. Each year, NANB will randomly select a sample of members to receive an audit form.

If you are selected, you will be asked a series of questions to illustrate what learning activities you have implemented, how they relate to your self-assessment and learning objective(s), and how the learning activities informed and influenced your professional practice.

Any information provided to NANB is confidential and will only be used for the purpose of determining that the CCP requirements are being met or that remediation is required to assist nurses in meeting the requirements.

Completing the CCP requirements is a continuous process in which learning objectives set in one year may be carried over to the following year. Although nurses are required to document annually how they are meeting the CCP requirements, it is recognized that it is a dynamic process which builds on previous learning plans. For this reason it is recommended that nurses retain their CCP documentation for a five year period.
