

IMMEDIATE OPPORTUNITY FOR NURSE EDUCATOR

Part-time Term Contract Position (December 2011- March 31, 2012)

The Nurses Association of New Brunswick (NANB) is partnering with the RN Professional Development Centre (RN-PDC) in Halifax, Nova Scotia to establish a satellite Bridging/Re-Entry Program for internationally educated nurses in New Brunswick. This program will be delivered through a combination of on-line self-paced learning as well as through instructor-led classroom and clinical learning.

NANB is seeking an experienced nurse educator to support the development and delivery of this program in New Brunswick. This part-time term position will focus primarily on working with RN-PDC faculty in the review of on-line French program content and testing of learning materials.

This part-time position may develop into a full-time position in April 2012, with responsibility for the coordination and delivery of the satellite bridging program in New Brunswick including:

- Developing administrative partnerships for the delivery of the clinical component of the bridging program;
- Coordination of all facets of the satellite program in New Brunswick, once implemented;
- Managing the administrative logistics of all clinical placements once the program goes live;
- Being trained to provide competency assessments where required; and
- Delivering the French bridging program in New Brunswick, through a combination of on-line classroom and clinical learning modalities.

Qualifications

- Baccalaureate in Nursing
- Masters Degree in Nursing or Masters of Education (consideration will also be given to applicants with Masters degree in another discipline who possess the necessary clinical experience/competencies and those with a Masters degree in progress)
- Eligibility for registration with NANB
- Certificate in Basic Life Support C
- Minimum three years clinical experience
- Current experience with classroom and clinical teaching is required
- Current experience with curriculum development; multiple instructional and delivery methods (including on-line); and exam development is required
- Well-developed verbal and written communication skills in both official languages
- Working knowledge of computer applications, such as Microsoft Word & PowerPoint; experience with on-line learning management systems such as Articulate and Eliminate preferred.

This all-inclusive contract position will be for approximately 20 hours per week over the course of the contract period based on a competitive hourly compensation.
