



FAQ - What are the Requirements to Provide Telenursing Care in N.B.?

What are the requirements to provide telenursing care to residents of N.B. or clients located in N.B.?

Nurses¹ are required to hold an active registration with the Nurses Association of New Brunswick (NANB) to provide telenursing care to N.B. residents or clients located in N.B. (even temporarily). This also applies to managers/supervisors of nurses delivering telenursing services (NANB, 2023).

NANB's standards of practice and guidelines are to be followed in the provision of telenursing care to residents or clients in N.B. (NANB, 2023). The following resources provide direction on nursing practice in N.B.:

Nurse practitioners providing telenursing care to residents or clients in N.B., must have reasonable access to a medical practitioner for the purpose of consultation and referral or transfer of care; the consulting physician must be licensed to practice medicine in NB.

What are the registration requirements to provide telenursing care to residents of another province or territory?

Registration requirements for the provision of telenursing care differ amongst nursing regulators. Nurses engaged in telenursing practice must establish whether registration is required in the jurisdiction(s) where the clients are located (even temporarily), where the nurse is physically located, or both (CNPS, 2020).

The nurse must contact the regulatory body where the client is located, to determine if registration in that jurisdiction is required prior to providing telenursing care to residents or clients of that province or territory.

Nurses located in N.B. do not require registration with NANB to provide telenursing care to clients outside of N.B.
