
NANB Registration Requirements For Internationally Educated Nurses National Nursing Assessment Service (NNAS) Application Candidates must submit documents and credentials to the National Nursing Assessment Service (NNAS) for verification and assessment. NANB Application & Pay Fees Once candidates have received their NNAS Advisory Report, they must apply to NANB and pay the applicable fees. **Language Proficiency** Submit evidence of language proficiency in Either English or French. **Currency of Practice in Last Five Years** Candidates must provide evidence of the number of hours practiced as a Registered Nurse (RN), in the last five (5) years, by submitting a Currency of Practice Affidavit, or by having completed your nursing education program in the last 5 years. **Complete Any Necessary Courses** Candidates must complete any necessary education requirements (online and/or in-person) at New Brunswick Community College (NBCC) or Collège Communautaire du Nouveau-Brunswick (CCNB) **Competency Assessment & Courses** Complete the Nursing Community Assessment Service (NCAS) and any courses identified to bridge compentency gaps. Temporary Registration Permit (TRP) A 1-year TRP will be issued to candidates and they must complete any additional education requirements during this time. **NANB Adaptation Program** While holding a 1-year TRP, candidates must complete the zone specific adaptation program. **Entry-to-Practice Exam**

Candidates must demonstrate success on the entry-to-practice exam (NCLEX-RN).
